Nóta ón Príomhoide/Principal's Note

These we hope will consist of our last two weeks of learning and fun via our digital platform. We are very conscious of overloading parents with information however we ask you to take quiet time aside for yourself to read the upcoming newsletters. We would like to keep you in the loop as much as possible.

As you may be aware the Department of Education released a document last Friday (Returning to Schools). As is understandable, it is next to impossible, for neither the Government or Department of Education to predict how the country will look in 10 weeks time. All schools will have to wait until final guidelines are available to us all. Once these are received we can start working on preparing the school environment so ensure the safety of children and staff. The document does instruct schools to focus on hand hygiene with the children in September. This is something you could continue practicing with your child at home so they are prepared for the return to school. When they return, time will be spent encouraging children to avail of the hand gel and the importance of its use, it will be the new norm until we are instructed otherwise.

The document also states that (situation pending nationwide) that blended learning may be a possibility. If this is the case we will continue to avail of our use of online learning/google classrooms and the children will continue with their current digital portfolio. Their work will be archived and work will continue in their account. Again we acknowledge your continued efforts to engage in the new method of learning while the Covid crisis is part of our lives.

We would ask parents *not to worry about something we can not control*, we will put our faith in the Government and Department of Education in the knowledge that they will do what is best for children in school settings nationwide. Either way Scoil Bhríde will be ready. We are currently, and will continue to, prepare over the summer months for the return of our children in September. So lets stay positive.

One of our parents, Mathew Conroy had gathered a group of helpers together to help with a few small jobs around your school. This project was put on hold due to our last storm and then then Covid-19. There are a number of inside and outside jobs to do once we feel it is safe to do so. We will keep you updated. All equipment will be supplied, paint, paint brushes, gloves & music.
