Léitheoireacht / Reading Tips

Here are some reading tips to coincide with our Léamhaton!

- **What's "Just Right"?** Children feel confident and competent when they read books that are "just right." But how do you find a "just right" book? Have your child read the back and front cover, and the first page of the book. If there are more than five words that he cannot pronounce or understand in context, the book may be too challenging. Be supportive about finding a more perfect fit. Choosing the right book will help your little reader feel successful. This is especially important for developing **comprehension skills**, they might be able to read a word but do they understand the word in context and the meaning of the sentence/paragraph??

- **Card Tricks.** Do you think effective reading only takes place at libraries and bookstores? Think again! There are reading opportunities everywhere. Go to a bookshop with your child and read the greeting cards together. Later, vote for the ones whose words convey the best birthday wish or just thinking of you sentiment.

- **Picture This!** During your next outing or gathering, take action-packed photos, then have your child create captions to go with each picture. Assemble the pictures and captions in a picture book or album or a copy, and add speech and thought bubbles to create a personalised graphic novel.

- **Last Comic Standing.** Take time to read and enjoy comic strips together. Share favorites from your own childhood and have your child put their favorites on the fridge. Read them aloud, and often—repetition is a great way to build reading skills.

- **Library!** Go to the library! The books are free and plentiful there. All the genres are catered for. You don't even have to take a book out but visit regularly to choose a book to read together there and then!

- **Monkey See, Monkey Do** as the old saying goes. If our children see us reading then they will see this as a natural part of routine. Maybe you are not a fan of books?? No matter, read a newspaper, magazine, a journal, a word puzzle book.

Cuairteoirí ón t-Sín/Chinese Visitors

Bhí seachtain iontach ag Rang a 3 le deanaí mar bhí cuairteoirí acu sa rang ón t-Sín.

This month Rang 3 had the opportunity to share their classroom, culture, languages and interests with pupils from Zibo in China. Zibo is in central Shandong province, China with a population of 4,530,597 people.

We had 8 pupils in our class. While they were quite shy at first they interacted straight away with the Rang 3 pupils. During the week we showed them how to play the tin whistle, some Irish dancing, gaelic football, hurling and some Irish history. There were another set of pupils in Claregalway Secondary school who were experiencing life there. For many of the pupils they did some subjects such as tech drawing for the first time.

We were lucky to have Miguel's mum (Rang 5) Deirdre who arranged a tour for us in Claregalway Castle, we were lucky enough to get into the stone carving workshop and see how the castle is being restored using ancient techniques. We also had the luck of visiting a snail farm called Exclusive Escargot. Farmer Stephen raises and sells on snails to many different countries around the world. While snails are cute—we would not and could not imagine eating any! Maybe our tastes will change when we are older.

Jessie one of the Chinese teachers taught us about the history of China and she showed us the ancient art of paper cutting. It is a very delicate job.

On their last day we gave them a sample of Irish food such as colcannon, potato cakes, black and white pudding and Tayto Sandwiches.

Harry and Freya were interviewed on Galway Bay FM by Keith Finnegan along with some Chinese students and students from Claregalway. They spoke so well, we are very proud of them. Harry later volunteered to be interviewed by TG4, so check out the podcast and watch out for our appearance on telly!
